

How do you keep fighting in the face of unimaginable horror? THE VOLUNTEER, by Jack Fairweather (Custom House; June 25, 2019), is the untold story of one of the greatest heroes of the Second World War. In the Summer of 1940, after the Nazi occupation of Poland, Witold Pilecki, an underground operative accepted a mission to uncover the fate of thousands of people being interred at a new concentration camp on the border of the Reich. His mission was to report on Nazi crimes and raise a secret army to stage an uprising. The name of the camp—Auschwitz. It was only after arriving at the camp that he started to discover the Nazi's terrifying designs. Over the next two and half years, Witold forged an underground army that smuggled evidence of Nazi atrocities to the West, culminating in the mass murder of over a million Jews. His reports from the camp were to shape the Allies' response to the Holocaust.

Completely erased from the historical record by Poland's Communist government, Pilecki remains almost unknown to the world. Now, with exclusive access to previously hidden diaries, family and camp survivor accounts and recently declassified files, Jack Fairweather reveals Witold's exploits with vivid, cinematic bravura. He also uncovers the tragic outcome of Pilecki's mission, in which the ultimate betrayal came not on the Continent, but England.

THE VOLUNTEER is an enthralling story of resistance and heroism against the most horrific circumstances, and one man's attempt to change the course of history.

Jack Fairweather is a graduate of Oxford University and has been a correspondent for the *Washington Post* and the *Daily Telegraph*, where he was the paper's Bagdhad and Persian Gulf bureau chief.

While living in Baghdad as the *Daily Telegraph*'s bureau chief, Jack met his wife-to-be and lived in the house of Saddam's former perfume supplier alongside other reporters. As the



violence escalated in Iraq Jack was fortunate to survive a suicide bomb attack, a kidnapping attempt, and almost daily mortar attacks around their house.

His reporting while an embedded reporter during the Iraq invasion won him the British Press Award (the British equivalent to the Pulitzer Prize.) He now lives a quieter life, writing history books while raising his three daughters in Vermont. He the author of *A War of Choice*, and *The Good War*.
